As girls, their fierce and ambitious mother trained them for a singing career à la The Andrews Sisters. Now, past and present collide within the once-vibrant guesthouse as memories resurface with haunting clarity. *The Hills of California* explores how sibling bonds both sustain and suffocate, and how songs of youth echo through life. **Loretta Greco**, former Artistic Director of San Francisco's Magic Theatre, returns to the Bay Area to direct the West Coast debut of this masterwork.
